BPW: Sustainable economic engine restoring a forest in peril

Great Abaco island's pine forest, which supports a wide variety of endemic plant and animal species, was devistated by Hurricane Dorian in 2019.

Utilizing a modern and environmentally friendly logging alternative to traditional harvesting methods, BPW unifies remediation and regeneration. It encourages a healthy forest by removing dead and dying trees while planting up to 100,000 new trees each year.

This enriches surrounding ecosystems, strengthening the coastal, mangrove, and marine environments. BPW's harvesting, processing, and restoration efforts will follow internationally accepted sustainability practices, the specific provisions of Bahamian law, and an Environmental Management Plan approved by The Bahamas' Ministry of Environment.



Preliminary Technical Notations

Colour. The heartwood is a reddish brown while the sapwood is yellowish white and distinct from the heartwood.

Grain/Texture. Straight grained with a medium to coarse texture and a slight satin or silk feel.

Average Dried Weight. 39 lbs/3 (625 kg/m3)

Janka Hardness. 1671 avg.

Crushing Strength. 7,890 lbf/in2

Shrinkage. Radial: 6.6%, Tangential: 7.1%, Volumetric: 13.7%

Kiln Drying. Our lumber is kiln-dried to reduce moisture content to 6-10%, as well as setting pitch in the lumber for end uses.

Workability. The pine glues and finishes very well. The lumber is very hard, and it is advisable to predrill holes for fastening and finishing works.
